As 2017 begins, our school community is immensely proud of all that we have already accomplished this academic year. The many achievements of our students and staff are truly inspiring, and we look forward to building on that progress in the months ahead. With Quarter One behind us and Quarter Two coming to a close, we have systems and processes in place to help our students identify and achieve important goals for the 2016-2017 academic year.

I am also proud to announce that American History High School continues to be one of Newark's top-choice destinations for students. This year, we welcomed over one hundred new students into our Freshmen class – the Class of 2020! We are an attractive choice among Newark High Schools, especially for students who are looking for a smaller, caring learning environment.

Our results continue to speak for themselves. First, 98-percent of the Class of 2016 who began the year in September 2015 graduated last year. Better still, 100 percent of the students who graduated last year were accepted into 2- and 4-year college programs.

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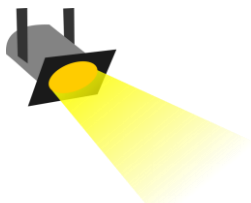
This is a great example of Eagle Pride and our students continuing to display a dedication to academic excellence and personal integrity at American History.

Especially important is the fact that our students continue to outperform Newark public and charter schools on PARCC assessments. Last year, our students had one of the highest growth rates among all Newark High Schools on the English Language Arts PARCC assessment and made great strides on the Math PARCC assessment. PARCC assessments provide an important measure of how well we are educating our students. PARCC scores are central to the ongoing success of American History High School. We are close to achieving 100 percent PARCC participation – another example of our leadership among high schools in Newark.

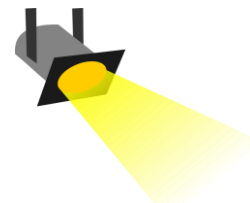
