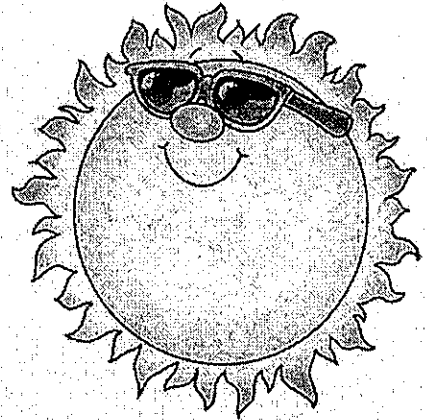


# Summer Packet for Students Entering Third Grade
